



San Antonio Airport System Announces New Staff in Airport Emergency Management and Airport Integrated Control Center Positions

San Antonio, TX (April 29, 2015) – The San Antonio Airport System announces the promotions of Dawson Frank to Airport Emergency Management (EM) Manager and Ryan Rocha to Airport Integrated Control Center (AICC) Manager.



As the Airport EM Manager, Dawson will be responsible for coordinating with local, regional and national organizations and facilitating full scale emergency exercises at the airport. The AICC will serve as the primary source of information, communication, and operational flow for all stakeholders at SAT. Ryan has been involved in aviation for 20 years and most recently served as the Airport Operations Manager for SAT since 2007. He assumed his role as AICC Manager April 25th.
