



Domestic Violence Quarterly Report

1st Quarter - January 1 to March 31, 2013


The San Antonio Police Department handles over a million calls for service each year. The data on this quarterly report reflects domestic violence call data from January 1 to March 31, 2013.



Domestic violence calls continue to be elevated on the weekends with Saturday and Sunday being the highest days recorded.



Domestic violence calls for service increased 5.4% during the first quarter of 2013. Central and South service areas had the highest gains at 13% each. South Patrol had the greatest decrease of almost 4% for the quarter. West Patrol continues to respond to twice as many domestic violence calls as each of the other service areas.

2012 Year Review



Calls for service do not provide an accurate measurement of crime so we typically rely on offense reports written by our officers. Thus far, only West Patrol and East patrol are reporting an increase in domestic violence cases. All the other service areas are reporting a decrease. The Northwest (Prue Rd) service area has the greatest decrease at 12.9% this quarter. The charts below contain data for the first quarter of each year listed.

Family Violence related murders are generally less than 10% of the overall homicide total. However, homicides thus far in 2013 are down significantly. This artificially raises the percentage of family violence related cases at this time.
