Frank R. Miller

Frank Miller was named Aviation Director in May 2009. As director, he oversees the day-to-day operations at the San Antonio International Airport and Stinson Municipal Airport. In 2010, the International Airport saw the completion of the \$500 million expansion program with the opening of the new terminal and bi-level roadway system. The 250,000 square foot Terminal B replaces the outdated Terminal 2 with eight gates and a more open and airy design. The new roadway system serves both Terminals and includes new signage. Stinson Municipal Airport has also seen a major milestone met during his tenure with the completion of its \$3.5 million runway expansion project to 5,000 square feet. This additional footage will help attract more general aviation business to Stinson, the second-oldest continuing airport in the United States.

Mr. Miller brings with him more than 27 years experience as an Aviation Director with profit and loss responsibility for airports of increasing size and operational complexity. Miller has successfully directed two major airport capital development projects and his innovated management style has attracted new air carrier service and expanded revenue generation opportunities.

Prior to his appointment, Mr. Miller served 22 years as the Airport Director for the Pensacola Regional Airport in Pensacola, Florida. During his tenure, Miller developed a private-public financing construction program for a new air traffic control tower which was completed with no Airport or City funds. The Federal Aviation Administration currently uses this model developed by Mr. Miller for their construction-leaseback program.

While serving as president of the Florida Airport Managers Association, Mr. Miller established the Governmental Liaison Committee to establish a long-term partnership with Florida's U.S. Congressional Delegation to improve the federal dollar allocations for Florida's airports.

Prior to his tenure in Florida, Mr. Miller served as the Airport Manager for the Walker Field Airport Authority in Grand Junction, Colorado, as well as the Airport Manager for the City and Borough of Juneau, Alaska.
